



APPLICATION TO OFFSET TOTAL REDUCTIONS IN AD VALOREM TAX REVENUE FROM REFUNDS DUE TO A CATASTROPHIC EVENT

By October 1, 2024, affected taxing jurisdictions in fiscally constrained counties, as defined in s. 218.67(1), Florida Statutes, must apply to the Department of Revenue for a distribution to offset the reduction in ad valorem tax revenues refunded to taxpayers due to a catastrophic event in accordance with section 197.319, F.S. See section 62 of Chapter 2024-158, Laws of Florida.

Attach a copy of Form DR-522, *Report of Total Reductions in Taxes from Catastrophic Events*, as reported by the county tax collector, required under s. 197.319(5)(b), F.S. The form will list the reduction in ad valorem tax revenues that affected the taxing jurisdiction. Provide any additional documentation to support the reduction in ad valorem tax revenue, if applicable. (Form DR-522 is incorporated by reference in Rule 12D-16.002, F.A.C.)

Affected taxing jurisdictions must be registered with the state's Vendor Information Portal and submit an electronic W-9 form with the Department of Financial Services to receive funds from the state. All affected taxing jurisdictions planning to apply to the Department of Revenue should ensure they are properly registered.
