Report Okaloosa County Tourist Development Tax to the Okaloosa County Clerk of Court Beginning January 1, 2022

Beginning January 1, 2022, the Okaloosa County tourist development tax collected on or after January 1, 2022, must be reported and paid directly to the Okaloosa County Clerk of Court. The Okaloosa County Board of County Commissioners adopted Ordinance No. 2021-22 authorizing the Clerk of Court to collect and administer the tourist development tax.

Beginning January 1, 2022, report the Okaloosa County tourist development tax on transient rentals to the Okaloosa County Clerk of Court.
