## Communications Services Tax Local Jurisdiction Changes

#### Local Tax Rate Expiration Date Change

The City of Bonita Springs approved an ordinance changing the expiration date of the communications services tax local tax rate from December 31, 2022, to the date of repeal of the tax rate. The total local rate will not change and will remain 3.91%.

### **Jurisdiction Name Change**

Effective January 1, 2023, the *Communications Services Tax Return* (Form DR-700016) will reflect the name change of the City of Lake Worth to the City of Lake Worth Beach. The total local tax rate will not change and will remain 5.82%.

The Florida Department of Revenue (Department) is required to send this notice for the local communications services tax rate changes. (See section 202.21, Florida Statutes [F.S.].) A second notice, to be issued in late November 2022, will include **all rate changes effective January 2023**. (See sections 202.20(3) and 212.054(7)(a), F.S.) At that time the complete rate schedule will also be posted at **floridarevenue.com/taxes/cst**.
