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Electronic File and Pay Requirements for Taxes, Fees, and Surcharges

Effective January 1, 2023, taxpayers must file tax returns and remit payments of taxes and fees electronically if the tax amount paid in the prior state fiscal year (July 1 – June 30) is \$5,000 or more. This requirement applies separately to each tax and is based on the amounts remitted as estimated payments, tentative payments, tax return payments, or any other type of payment made for the specific tax.

The reduction in the threshold requiring electronic filing of returns and electronic remittance of payments of taxes and fees from \$20,000 to \$5,000 will affect those taxpayers who file and remit the following taxes:

- Communications Services
- Corporate Income
- Documentary Stamp
- Fuel Local government User, Mass Transit System Provider
- Fuel Pollutants
- Gross Receipts
- Insurance Premium
- Prepaid Wireless E911 Fee
- Sales and Use (includes local option sales taxes, surcharges, surtaxes, solid waste fees and surcharges)

The reduction in the threshold requiring electronic remittance of payments of taxes and fees from \$20,000 to \$5,000 will also affect those taxpayers who remit the following taxes:

- Fuel Florida Air Carriers
- Severance (includes oil, gas and sulfur production, solid minerals, and Miami-Dade Lake Belt Mitigation Fee)
