Firefighters' and Police Officers' Pension Trust Funds Excise Taxes on Insurance Premiums Chapters 175 and 185, Florida Statutes

Updated Electronic Address/Jurisdiction Database for Determination of Insurance Premium Tax Situs

Insurance companies must register at http://geotax.state.fl.us to download the address/jurisdiction database files for insurance premium tax (IPT). Insurance companies use these database files to assign premiums to the proper local taxing jurisdictions for purposes of Firefighters' and Police Officers' Pension Trust Funds. The access code needed to register and create a user name and password is INS20090101, and is valid until April 2009. Once you use the code to register, it is no longer needed. Your user-name and password will also allow you access to files on our Internet site that you may find helpful.

The single address look-up function is available without logging into the database. The single address look-up feature reflects the most current information, including the updated database and any new information submitted by local governments.

An updated address/jurisdiction database for IPT is now available for download at http://geotax.state.fl.us. The updated address/jurisdiction database contains changes submitted by the local jurisdictions that reflect annexations, new addresses, and other relevant changes. In addition, there are changes to participating jurisdictions, which are listed below.

IPT address/jurisdiction database updates are completed every April and October. Insurers should continue to report their local insurance premium taxes annually on Schedules XII and XIII of their *Insurance Premium Taxes and Fees Return* (Form DR-908). The updated address/jurisdiction database available in October 2008 **is required** to be used to report premiums for the 2009 calendar year (Form DR-908 is due by March 1, 2010). Although not required, the updated address/jurisdiction database available in October 2008 may be used to report premiums for the 2008 calendar year (Form DR-908 is due by March 1, 2009).
